

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid

(FAFSA) is due March 10, 2014. In addition to this state deadline, students should also check with the colleges they are considering on attending since some schools have their own deadlines—for example, Purdue University has an early requirement of March 1. All current

seniors should be aware of these deadlines to make sure they have completed their FAFSA in time. More information is available by visiting https://fafsa.ed.gov.

For help in filling out the FAFSA, seniors (and

their parents) can attend **College Goal Sunday** which is an event
dedicated to helping students fill
out their FAFSA. While you're
there, they will also provide financial aid information and answer specific questions you might
have. If you start and submit your

Hebron Community Scholarship Fund

The Hebron Community Scholarship Fund is a tax-exempt charitable organization under the Section 501C(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and incorporated under Indiana law as a not-for-profit organization. Contributions are deductible for income, estate, and gift tax purposes. These contributions may assume many forms, such as:

- Outright gifts: Cash, stocks, bonds, real estate, or other property
- Deferred gifts: Wills, estates, trusts, and life insurance policies
- Special Gifts: Funds to underwrite specific projects previously approved by the scholarship committee
- Memorial Scholarship: In honor of a loved one, a contribution of \$3500.00 would provide a yearly scholarship in the amount of \$250.00 for 14 years.

Hebron Community Scholarship Fund, Inc. was established

in 2001 to provide scholarships to graduating Hebron High School students. So far, over 75 well deserving Hebron seniors had received scholarships. Every graduating Hebron High School senior can apply to receive a scholarship. Any senior interested needs only to fill out an application form and return it to the Guidance Office before the deadline.

HCSF is also has a support system component for children in the elementary school. If a child at Hebron Elementary School has the unfortunate experience of the loss of a parent or guardian, the HCSF will help the child by presenting a saving bond in the child's name. It will reach maturity when the student is a young adult. This support has been given to four Hebron Elementary students to date.
