# Dr. Martin Luther King Youth Workshop

On Monday, January 20, 2014, 14 Hebron High School students accompanied English teacher Jared Grigsby to Merrillville High School for the annual Martin Luther King, Jr. Youth Workshop. The day's program was different from what some past students experienced. Merrillville's S.T.A.N.D. club hosted four different workshops that centered on social issues that paid honor to Dr. King. Students from schools across northwest Indiana learned about and discussed racial profiling, body image, bullying, and the rights of transgender people.
