As a sponsor of the Eliot Rosewater Book Award program since the mid 1990s, the Hebron High School Media Center is once again introducing 20 new books from this program. The Eliot Rosewater Indiana High School Book Award (Rosie Award) is chosen annually by students across Indiana in grades nine through twelve. Students at participating high schools who read any of approximately 20 nominated books are eligible to rate each book they've read. As a result, the book with highest ratings is deemed the winner and is announced in May. Announcing the Rosie winner for 2011-12: Perfect Chemistry by Simone Elkeles. Perfect Chemistry is a fresh, urban twist on the classic tale of star-crossed
lovers. When Brittany Ellis walks into chemistry class on the first day of senior year, she has no clue that her carefully created "perfect" life is about to unravel before her eyes. She's forced to be lab partners with Alex Fuentes, a gang member from the other side of town, and he is about to threaten everything she's worked so hard for, her flawless reputation, her relationship with her boyfriend, and the secret that her home life is anything but perfect. Alex is a bad boy and he knows it. So when he makes a bet with his friends to lure Brittany into his life, he thinks nothing of it. But soon Alex realizes Brittany is a real person with real problems, and suddenly the bet he made in arrogance turns
into something much more. Overall, this is a solid romance with a satisfying ending. The two runner-up books for 2011-12 are Beastly by Alex Flinn and Maze Runner by James Dashner.
All 20 new titles for the 2012-13 school year are available for check out in the high school library.
