As a sponsor of the Eliot Rosewater Book Award program since the mid 1990s, the Hebron High School Media Center is once again introducing 20 new books from this program. The Eliot Rosewater Indiana High School Book Award (Rosie Award) is chosen annually by students across Indiana in grades nine through twelve. Students at participating high schools who read any of approximately 20 nominated books are eligible to rate each book they've read. As a result, the book with highest ratings is deemed the winner and is announced in May. Announcing the Rosie winner for 2011-12: Perfect Chemistry by Simone Elkeles.
