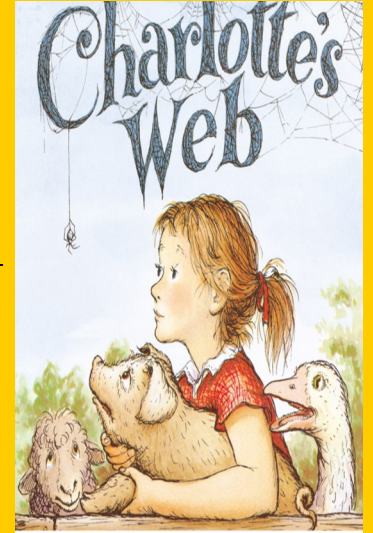

Dr. Kleefisch was born as an American citizen in Warrington, England on Burtonwood Air Force Base in 1957 while his father served in the US Air Force. In addition, Dr. Kleefisch worked as the assistant superintendent at Tri-Creek School Corporation in Lowell for 17 years.
